#### **Criteria for Membership:**

- 2. Be a resident of the CSRA (Burke, Columbia, Lincoln, McDuffie, Richmond counties in Georgia or Aiken and Edgefield counties in South Carolina) at the start of the New Member Course.
- 3. Demonstrate an interest in voluntarism and a commitment to community service.
- 4. Show an interest in developing your potential as a trained volunteer and leader.
- 5. Sign a contract outlining the responsibilities of new membership.

The Membership Development Committee studies the qualifications of each Prospective Member with regard to the purpose of the Junior League of Augusta and the criteria for membership.

#### **Process for Joining:**

- 1. Complete the Application for membership.
- 2. Attend a prospective member open house information session.
- 3. Pay new member course fee (\$125) by August 1, 2017.

#### **TIME COMMITMENTS:**

- 1. Attend New Member Orientation on Saturday, August 26, 2017 from 9:00am to 1:00pm. Breakfast and lunch provided by the Junior League.
- 2. Attend a Done In A Day for New Members (a one day service project) one Saturday in September. Times will be approximately 9am-1pm or shorter.
- 3. Attend New Member Meeting on Tuesday, October 17, 2017 from 6pm to 8pm.
- 4. Work one Holiday Market shift during the weekend of the event.
- 5. Attend New Member December Social during the month of December.
- 6. Attend a New Member Social Night during the month of January.
- 7. Attend a New Member Attic Sale Meeting on Tuesday, February 20, 2018 at the Augusta Exchange Club Fairgrounds from 6pm-8pm.
- 8. Attend Placement Day on Tuesday, April 10, 2018 at 6pm at the Junior League Office.
- 9. Attend General Membership Meetings each month, generally held on the *first* Tuesday of the month at 6pm and lasting approximately 2 hours. *Tentative* GMM dates: September 5, October 3, November 7, December 5 (Holiday Social), January 2, February 6, March 6, April 10 (Placement Day) and May 1 (End of Year Dinner). **1 absence will be allowed.**
- 10. Help with Holiday Market's Toy Drive.
- 11. Complete **ALL OBLIGATIONS** pertaining to Attic Sale, the League's largest fundraiser (March 3, 2018), as follows:
  - a. Work at least 2 bulk pick-up shifts. Bulk pick-ups are scheduled on Saturdays in the Fall and Winter. Each pick-up lasts approximately 2-3 hours.
  - b. Work all day (8:30 am until finished) on Move-In Day which will be Saturday, February 24, 2018.
  - c. Work 4 shifts lasting three hours (9am 12pm **OR** 6pm 9pm) during the Monday through Thursday of Sale Week (Monday, February 26-Thursday, March 1).
  - d. Work all day (6:30am until finished) on Saturday of Sale Day, Saturday, March 3, 2018.
  - e. Provide a minimum of \$200 in quota merchandise for Attic Sale, priced and stocked.
